

Traveling Triangle temporary residence

"I would like to call your special attention to the Traveling Triangle which has come for temporary residence to us. A special dispensation was granted to Orange Chapter, No. 23, to hold its Convocation in Hope lodge-room in East Orange, N.J., for the purpose of receiving Excellent Companion Leslie W. Reed, High Priest of Pythagoras Chapter, No. 17, of Hartford, Conn., together with his associate officers, Past High Priests, and a large delegation of Companions of his Chapter, to deposit this Triangle. This custom originated with the St. Patrick Chapter, No. 145, Toronto, Canada. The idea is to have it placed in the keeping of one Chapter in each Grand Chapter Jurisdiction until it has entered all of the Grand Chapter Jurisdictions of North America, and many others throughout the world. Upon its return, the Chapters through whose care it has passed will be invited to be represented in Toronto at a grand reunion. This custom has created renewed interest in Capitular Masonry, and, it is hoped, will strengthen the various ties of Companionship throughout the world."

At a later stage of the proceedings, "The Traveling Triangle, an emblem originating in the St. Patrick Chapter of Royal Arch Masons, located at Toronto, and now in the custody of Orange Chapter, No. 23, of New Jersey, was placed on the altar for inspection."
